Getting Started

- Find and engage the community
 - who are they?
 - what do they do?
 - what do they need?
- Find and engage the funding agency
 - They *must* support the community that you want to create the database for.
 - Speak to the program officer discuss specifics.

Make a Plan

- Database + software
 - what will you use?
 - agencies should not be funding ground up development anymore.
- Budget
 - can you use a fraction of an existing DBA or Sysadmin?
 - \$250K will only get you ~2.5FTEs

The Grant Application

- Specific Aims
 - circulate these in the community you will support
- Ask one or two trusted researchers to read the proposal (they will need adequate time to do so).
- Get as many letters of support as possible

 have them be specific about how the database will help their research, and how their research is funded.

Ongoing Concerns

- Keep in touch with your community
 - attend their meetings.
 - publish regularly if possible (~1/yr), to advertise the database
 - offer community services
 - listen to your users
- Remember if the community stops needing you, then the agency will stop funding you. You <u>serve</u> the community.
